

Academic Success

Staff and volunteers place importance on encouraging members, ages 6-18, to strive for academic excellence.

YOUTH EDUCATION SUCCESS (YES)/I-READY

Funded in part by the Florida Department of Education, the Gore Family Memorial Foundation Trust, the Florida Panthers Foundation, Jarden Consumer Solutions Foundation, Sun-Sentinel, TD Bank, City of Hollywood and Bank of America, YES provides Boys & Girls Club of Broward County members in grades 1-8 with a multifaceted educational program that seeks to improve their math and reading competency levels. In FY2015-2016, 983 members participated in the Yes Program at their Clubs.

POWER HOUR

Dedicated homework assistance is offered daily to all members from Boys & Girls Clubs professional staff and Broward County School Board Certified Teachers. It is encourages young people to view homework as an opportunity to learn to work independently, successfully complete projects on time and feel positive about their school accomplishments.



SUMMER READING & MATH ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

This summer, BGCBC partnered with the Children's Services Council (CSC) and the Lawrence J. & Florence A. De George Charitable Trust to provide 1,100 members with summer learning loss prevention programs in their Clubs. These academic programs were delivered by Certified Teachers from Broward County School Board hired by BGCBC.

ART WITH A HEART

This diversified program provides members with an outlet to express themselves positively while developing their imaginative, creative and individual talent. The Art With A Heart program enhances members educational abilities, home and social life while providing each member with a sense of hope, self-confidence, self-esteem and self-worth. Two local art exhibits allow members to display their talents to the community, family and their peers.

IONOSPHERE

Co-Founded by original Tuskegee Airman Leo Gray*, the Ionosphere Program exposes inner city Broward County youth to the Aviation Industry. A qualified instructor teaches math and science, good study habits and team building while highlighting African Americans' contribution to Aviation. Members learn about careers in the aviation field by meeting professionals, visiting aviation facilities and through the use of hands-on flight simulator equipment.

SAT PREP

The SAT Prep program allowed 17 Club members to participate in a ten-week New England Prep SAT course at the Levine/



Slaughter Boys & Girls Club. Members learned test-taking strategies for both the math and verbal sections of the SAT that improved students' performance on the standardized tests. In FY2015-2016, of those members who took the SAT Prep course, average SAT scores increased by over 200 points.





SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County provides numerous scholarship opportunities for Club members who are graduating seniors. Scholarship opportunities range from full rides to select colleges to partial scholarships for colleges, universities and vocational institutions. In FY2015-2016, BGCBC awarded 39 members with scholarships totaling over \$40,000.

Good Character & Citizenship

Staff and Volunteers provide opportunities for all members to engage in community service learning projects and leadership development.

TORCH CLUB

Character and leadership development and community services program for members ages 11-13. Over 150 members participated in the program which allowed staff to meet the special character needs of these younger adolescents at a critical stage in their life.

KEYSTONE CLUB

The Keystone Club is the Boys & Girls Club Movement's most dynamic teen program as it affords teens an opportunity to gain valuable leadership and community service experience. Each year, Keystone Club members get a chance to convene with other teens across the country at the National Keystone Conference. Over 150 teen



members participate in Keystone Club each year and in FY2015-2016, 16 teens attended the Boys & Girls Clubs of America National Keystone Conference.

BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE (BSO) ANTI-BULLYING PROGRAM

The BSO Anti-Bullying Program, completed by 34 members ages 10-14 at the Florence A. DeGeorge Club, is designed to decrease the instances of bullying, teen violence and gang involvement among our youth by improving positive character development and conflict resolution skills. talents to the community, family and their peers.

DALE CARNEGIE YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Dale Carnegie Program was offered to 23 teen Club members who were selected to be the Youth of the Year and alternate Youth of the Year for their home clubs. Instructors from Dale Carnegie worked with Club members to improve their public speaking and interview skills and instill a sense of confidence in preparation for their Youth of the Year interview and selection process. Since 2013, 55 teens have participated in this enriching program.

FAMILY STRENGTHENING PROGRAM (FSP)

FSP is an evidence-based nationally and internationally recognized parenting and family strengthening program for high-risk and general population families. FSP is found to significantly improve parenting skills and family relationships, reduce problem behaviors, delinquency and alcohol and drug abuse in children and to improve social competencies and school performance. The Family Strengthening Program served 39 parents and 54 children during the FY2015-2016 Program Year.







Healthy Lifestyles

Staff and Volunteers encourage a lifelong commitment to the benefits of healthy nutrition and physical fitness.

BGCBC SNACK & MEAL PROGRAM

This free program offers members a healthy snack and hot meal Monday through Friday year-round and on Saturdays during the school year. Funded by the Florida Department of Health and the United States Department of Agriculture, the program provides members with healthy foods that they may not get at home due to limited income or insufficient information on healthy eating. Since its inception in 2011, the program has served over 4 million meals to children throughout Broward County.

DEFEATING FOOD INSECURITY PROGRAM

This supplemental nutrition program provides parents with weekly meal packs of rice and beans, oatmeal and macaroni and cheese that offset grocery budgets and help feed members and their families. On Saturdays, members receive a Weekend Lunch Box with kid friendly meals to be consumed when the Clubs are closed on Sundays.

CULINARY ARTS PROGRAM

During the year-long program, members benefit from learning valuable aptitudes from an experienced Chef while preparing and eating dishes using fresh foods. The program also includes field trips to local Culinary Arts Institutes, vendors, restaurants, hotels, dining rooms and the opportunity to listen and learn from various guest speakers in the culinary industry. Last year, over 350 members participated in the Culinary Arts program.

BGCBC SWIM ACADEMY

The Swim Academy teaches members, ages 6-18, the fundamentals of swimming and water safety through swim classes which range from beginner to advanced levels. In FY2015-2016 1,364 Club members learned about water safety, the benefits of swimming, and about careers available to those with swimming skills.

ATHLETIC LEAGUES

In addition to daily physical fitness activities that build aerobic endurance and strength in our members, BGCBC also offers athletic programs that promote teamwork and fair play. Our athletic leagues include flag football (400 participants), basketball (400 participants), cheerleading (286 participants), Sloane Stephens Tennis Program

(56 participants), First Tee Golf Program (45 participants), Florida

Panthers Street Hockey (1,056 participants) and the Channing Crowder Youth Football Camp (90 participants), allowing members to learn about different sports while also working with fellow members.

TOWER GARDEN PROGRAM

The program teaches members the importance of sustainability, water conservation, the life cycle of plants, how to grow their own food and most importantly, the benefits of making healthy food choices. In addition to this phenomenal handson learning experience, we are able to furnish fresh produce for our Culinary Arts program and other Club programs. In FY 2015-2016, 370 members took part in the planting, growing and harvesting of fresh vegetables and herbs from Tower Gardens in their Clubs.



Teen Focus

In order to achieve our vision of helping our members graduate from high school with a plan for the future, we must keep them engaged through their teen years. Our research shows that when provided with a space of their own and programs that meet their needs, teen members are more likely to remain active in their Club.

COLLEGE CORNER

College Corner allows Club members who may have never considered college or who are unaware of the college admissions process to receive hands-on assistance with all things college-related. It promotes higher education and higher level career aspirations to youth, and gives them the tools to get started on their professional journeys. A full-time youth development professional with a college degree mentors teens ages 14-18 on college choices, financial aid, the admissions process, and scholarships.

ANNUAL CAREER DAY & COLLEGE TOURS

The Annual Career Day brings together over 15 local colleges and universities to present to over 200 youth about different career options including Nursing, Law Enforcement, Private Investigation, Education, Business Management and



Construction. This summer, 200 Club members had the opportunity to attend tours of local colleges and universities. Teens also attend the Greater Ft. Lauderdale College Fair hosted by the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC).

GENERALS CLUB CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM & CAREER DAY

The Generals Club Construction Program gets Club Members engaged and excited about a career in the trades by offering career tours, interactive carpentry classes and the Annual Generals Construction Career Day (GCCD). During the GCCD, construction professionals lead hands-on activities with teen Club Members. Highlighted trades include air conditioning, crane operation, flooring, welding, landscaping and more! Over 200 Club Members participated in FY2015-2016. As a result of the Generals Club Construction Program, 12 BGCBC members and alumni are employed in the construction and building industry and as a group this year will earn a total salary of over \$211,000.

ABC INSTITUTE READY SET BUILD PROGRAM & OSHA 10 CLASS

Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County partnered with ABC Institute to provide the OSHA 10 safety class for 9 Club members ages 16 – 18. The three-day class took place over summer 2016 where all Club members earned their OSHA 10 card, demonstrating understanding and competence of safety on a construction site. Since the program's inception, 75 teen members have earned an OSHA 10 certification through the program.



FOOD HANDLING CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

This program allows our teen members to become Food-Handler certified—a nationally recognized certification in the food industry. Certifications, which are good for 3 years, enable teens to obtain a job within the food industry much quicker than their non-certified counterparts and will also be paid a higher salary than someone without certification. In FY2015-2016, SafeStaff certifications were earned by 8 Club members. Since its inception, 33 members have earned certifications through the program.

BOAT BUILDING & WOODSHOP

Members learn about the art and skill of wood-working for the building industry in classes led by volunteers and staff who have experience in the field. Each year, members build a boat and race against other marine enthusiasts in the Annual Plywood Regatta.

LIPS ROAD CODE

Teen Driving Program that teaches teen Club Members basic safety information and procedures while on the road. In FY2015-2016, 100 members went through the UPS Road Code program, with over 400 members participating since 2010. This year, Maxine Delacruz, a member of the Marti Huizenga Boys & Girls Club, was chosen to serve as an ambassador to introduce the UPS Road Code Program to teens in their communities and help educate them and the general public on different safe driving principles.



The Youth of the Year is the Boys & Girls Clubs of America's premier youth recognition for Club members ages 14-18. Youth of the Year promotes and celebrates services to the Club and community as



well as members' academic performance and their vision for America's youth. Clubs select a Youth of the Year and an alternate to participate in the program. Each Clubs' Youth of the Year interviews with a panel of Boys & Girls Clubs board members and supporters before one youth is selected to be the Broward County Youth of the Year. Congratulations to Mychaela Ojeda, the 2016 Broward County Youth of the Year!






Youth of the Year

Youth of the Year (YOY) is the Boys & Girls Clubs of America's premier youth recognition program for Club members ages 14 – 18. YOY promotes and celebrates service to the Club and community. The program highlights the candidates' academic achievements, their vision for America's youth, their personal brand and healthy lifestyles. Each year a finalist from each of BGCBC's 12 clubs is chosen to

Mychaela Ojeda from the Dr. Harold Reitman Club. Mychaela is an exceptional young lady who has overcome personal obstacles to become a leader and role model for younger Members. During Hurricane Wilma, Mychaela's family lost their home and all of their possessions. During this time, Mychaela depended on the Boys & Girls Clubs to help keep her grades up, eat a nutritious snack and lunch – this would sometimes be the last meal she would eat for the day. After 10 months, Mychaela and her family found an apartment that they could afford. With the help of BGCBC and the Kiwanis Club they

were able to fully furnish the apartment. This is just one of the many ways that the Boys & Girls Clubs has impacted Mychaela's life and she has done her best to give back. She was the President of the Torch Club and Vice President of the Keystone Club where she completed over 1,000 hours of community service.

Mychaela graduated from Boyd H. Anderson High School in 2016 and is currently a freshman at Florida A&M University studying Business Administration. Her goal is to earn a Master's Degree in Sports Management.






